



THE STORY OF THE STONES

The rocks for painting at the Eco Expo were donated by Luck Stone. They are some 150,000,000 years old. In the Jurassic period, rifts opened around Centreville and filled with molten rock. The hard stone that formed as the lava cooled is called diabase. It is also known as bluestone and is the familiar gravel found in concrete, railroad beds, and roads.


Fairfax County in the 1920s needed a source of crushed stone for new road-building projects like Lee Highway. The Wells property just west of Centreville already had a gravel pit. In January 1928, the County leased land from J.R. and Daisy Wells and from their neighbors William and Henrietta Griffin and expanded the quarry. By May, the county was selling surplus stone, chips, and dust to Manassas and other towns and using the proceeds to support the county road fund.

In 1932 the state took over responsibility for road-building and the Centreville quarry operation passed into private hands. On January 5, 1938, contracts for Wells, Griffin, and the adjoining Naylor property were assigned to Fairfax Quarries, Incorporated, whose president was Charles S. Luck, Jr. After 100 years, the quarry operation is winding down. It is still owned by the Luck family who plan on filling in the pits and reclaiming them. 

The Planning Committee is proud to continue to recognize individuals and groups that have given the greater Centreville community years of service, leadership, and heart.




CITIZEN OF THE YEAR Mr. John Boylan came to Centreville by way of his military career. Like many before him, once he experienced the community, he never left. When John became the president/CEO of the Dulles Chamber of Commerce, he instituted the three pillars of Commerce, Community, and Connections to focus on both the present and future of our part of Fairfax County. He is passionate about the impact of the Metro extension on Centreville and founded the Centreville Leadshare group to further inform citizens and businesses about new opportunities. Even after retiring from the Chamber, John continued to look out for his community by resurrecting the Centreville Committee, initializing the first State of Centreville for the Dulles Regional Chamber of Commerce, and being an active member of the Centreville Study Task Force. John sees a future for Centreville in which each family and community member has a heightened awareness of our historic areas, enjoys safe passages for walkers and bikers, and has an eternal view of the impressive mountain ranges during many sunsets.

NONPROFIT CITIZEN OF THE YEAR Since its founding in 2018, the Scott A. and Phyllis P. Crabtree Foundation has provided grants and other financial support to organizations throughout Northern Virginia. Their efforts have supported day care facilities, scholarships, animal welfare, and children's medical needs. Western Fairfax Christian Ministries and the Clifton Lions Club have received grants to further their charitable efforts in the community. The Crabtree Foundation recently sponsored a children's book featuring police dogs, the proceeds of which go to support the lives of retired police dogs. Children in our community have benefited from the Foundation's support of the annual winter coat drive sponsored by the Sully Supervisor's Office. It is with great appreciation that we recognize and celebrate the many contributions of the Scott A. and Phyllis P. Crabtree Family Foundation for the greater good of our Centreville community.



COMMUNITY PARTNER Paul Woods took his role as Community Developer for the Department of Neighborhood and Community Services very seriously – he knew everybody and was instrumental in fostering connections between new and old friends, colleagues, and businesses. When the Centreville Day Planning Committee was in a pinch a few years ago, Paul, without hesitation, gave Centreville Day the support it needed to provide shuttle bus service for offsite parking - and that service continues today. For the past two years, Paul attended meetings of the Centreville Community Task Force as an interested audience member and actively promoted citizen involvement with the Centreville Study Survey. In 2024, Paul was the chair of Fairfax County's Black History Month Committee. Today we express our appreciation for Paul's partnership with Centreville through thoughtful encouragement and synergy between and among all members of our community.

COMMUNITY PARTNER Our community is a safer place due in a large part to the thoughtful efforts given by Master Police Officer Megan Hawkins. She was viewed as a *neighborhood officer*, who was an integral part of the community. For many years Meg supported Centreville Day by gathering a wonderful array of police outreach activities and serving as the department's event photographer. She enthusiastically engaged community partners such as the Rotary Club of Centreville-Chantilly in collecting toys at Christmas along with mittens, gloves, hats, and socks for students in our elementary schools. Meg's partnership with Centreville is much appreciated as she has been committed to building a safe and welcoming environment for all members of our community.





DENNIS HOGGE COMMUNITY HISTORY AWARD For many years, it was not Centreville Day without the joyful appearance of The Honorable Gerald "Gerry" Connolly. He spoke eloquently on the stage about the growth of Historic Centreville Park, rode in the back of a pick-up truck during the Parade - waving with such enthusiasm - and engaged with community constituents as he walked around the event. During his service as a member of the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors from 1995 to 2008, including five years as chairman, Gerry was instrumental in securing funding for the Washington Metro's Silver Line extension and in challenging the Board to dedicate 10% of Fairfax County land as parkland, a goal that was instrumental in creating Historic Centreville Park. Connolly's love of history was evident as he attended the Fairfax County History Commission's annual conferences nearly 20 years. He was also a strong advocate for environmental protection, and, in recognition of his local work, Fairfax County named the Gerry Connolly Cross County Trail in his honor in 2014.

Today we honor and celebrate Gerry with the Dennis Hogge Community Historian Award for his commitment and support of history in Centreville and throughout Fairfax County.

Dennis Hogge (1949-2024) loved history and embraced it in many ways, from writing a published historical account of the Brady studio's photographic survey of Centreville, to owning and preserving historic buildings, being a public advocate for preservation, and simply cherishing and sharing the memories of his youth and the elders he knew. The Community History award celebrates the many ways community history is shared, recorded, and preserved. Dennis Hogge's grandchildren, Jackson Bohannon and Adelaide Felts, will present the award on behalf of the Centreville Day Planning Committee.




